An experienced line-up of speakers fronted the session that included Mohd Redzuan Hasan, the Malaysian Deputy Accountant General for Operations, David Hardidge, Director – Technical and Treasury Products, Queensland Audit Office and Le Thi Tuyet Nhung, Deputy General Director, Accounting and Auditing Policy Department (AAPD), Ministry of Finance, Vietnam. Participants from around the region tuned in to learn how adequate levels of transparency and accountability coupled with good financial and performance management are all hallmarks of a well-performing public sector. The speakers also explored some of the opportunities and challenges that surround public sector financial reporting.

The new-normal of mergers and acquisitions



Following a noticeable slowdown, merger and acquisition activity is expected to pick up in the medium term, albeit in a dramatically different landscape. Andrew Heng FCPA (Aust.), Group Managing Partner of Baker Tilly, says the next phases of M&A may occur in four potentially overlapping waves. "The first wave of M&A will come from deals that are currently under way," he says.

Tourism sector: Dealing with a vanishing market

Peter Hong FCPA (Aust.), Managing Director of Ramsay Sime Darby Healthcare, which operates six hospitals in Malaysia and Indonesia, says that the Malaysian Government is aiming to boost medical tourism during the



pandemic, where possible. With only a slim opportunity for international medical tourists to get into the country, he says Malaysian hospitals are focusing on local medical tourism.

> Assessing the reset on international standard-setting



Key stakeholders around the world like Alex Ooi FCPA (Aust.), Executive Officer of the Audit Oversight Board, have been broadly supportive of the Monitoring Group of International Financial Regulators' recommendations for a restructuring of the boards that set international standards.

Diversity on boards: Strong processes, good governance

Board diversity is an outcome, not a driver, of excellent governance. Narita Naziree FCPA (Aust.) shares that when Maybank became the number one employer of choice in Malaysia, the company saw diversity working its way up through the organization. The number of women in management positions has risen from 17 per cent in 2009 to 35 per cent in 2020.

> University engagements to prepare final year students

The business development team collaborated with several universities to assist final year students to ease into the career world. At Taylor's University's annual 'Professional Development Week' in October, CPA Australia facilitated a panel session with practitioners from PwC, EY and KPMG to look at how technology was impacting the accounting field and reshaping the future of work.
