The CPA designation inspires trust, confidence and respect. To share knowledge on current and topical business issues with the finance community in Singapore, CPA Australia collaborated with The Business Times on a thought leadership feature series published in the media organisation's print and digital platforms. The series profiles our members and their respective expertise on topics such as finance transformation, risk management, and cybersecurity.









It was a "Business As Un-Usual" theme at the annual CPA Congress in Singapore. Held on 2 October, the full day conference brought together more than 300 accounting and finance professionals from Singapore and the region. The program featured industry and thought leaders from companies such as Microsoft, Starbucks Singapore, Mercer, Accenture and more.

John Lo FCPA (Aust.), CFO, Tencent Group, delivered the lead keynote on A Smart Future of Innovative Technologies, sharing China's experience. Congress delegates in Singapore also heard insights into key business trends such as smart robots, ethical hacking, navigating volatile geo-economics and finance transformation.

In line with this year's theme, delegates experienced a different Congress. Checkin to Congress was done digitally with a new electronic arrivals system. For the first time, delegates were able to journey through the transformation of the accounting profession through a Virtual Reality (VR) Experience.

CONNECTING CFOS

More than 150 Chief Financial Officers and finance leaders attended the 8th CFO Connect Symposium at the Conrad Centennial Singapore on 11 July. Keynote speaker Mr Chng Kai Fong, Managing Director of the Economic Development Board, addressed the CFOs on playing a key role in their organisations' digital transformation journey.

Industry experts shared their analysis and insights into trends that will shape the evolving roles of CFOs, such as artificial intelligence and robotics in finance transformation, cybersecurity and anti-bribery.

At this engaging and dynamic learning event, CFOs were able to engage with our distinguished speakers and panellists, and connect with other senior finance leaders to build their networks.

LEAD THE FUTURE OF THE ACCOUNTING PROFESSION

PUBLIC SECTOR INNOVATION SERIES

CPA Australia and KPMG Singapore jointly hosted a series of events for the public sector to discuss current and emerging issues that are defining the risk and compliance environment in the public sector.

Two breakfast talks focused on topics such as enhanced Enterprise Risk Management (ERM), Governance, Risk and Compliance (GRC) systems, cloud computing and cyber threat hunting. The series culminated in an annual in-depth briefing and discussion on 16 August which examined the findings of the 2019 Auditor-General's Report and best practices that government agencies can adopt.

Some 200 public sector officers also gained insights into enhanced ERM for the public sector and technology enablement in risk and controls, particularly in an environment of rapid digital transformation.





CPA Australia and KPMG held an annual in-depth briefing for 200 public sector officers on the findings from the latest AGO Report, as well as to discuss issues relating to technology enablement in risk and controls.


Members also visited one of the masters of paper objects that Chinese use as offerings to ancestors.


GROWING A FINTECH ECONOMY

PROVIDE RELEVANT LEARNING AND **DEVELOPMENT CONTENT, RESOURCES AND TOOLS**

UPSKILLING FINANCE PROFESSIONALS

The finance function is rapidly being transformed by digitalisation, resulting in a critical need for finance and accounting professionals to expand their technical and business skillsets.

CPA Australia in Singapore has a strong partnership with the Employment and Employability Institute (e2i). This has resulted in the curation of the **Digital in Finance** suite of practical workshops designed to meet the lifelong learning needs of professionals in an ever-changing business landscape. The program included key topics on financial reporting standards, finance and operations, disruptive technologies and business valuation.

Riding on the success of the Finance Game Changer Series with the Singapore Management University (SMU), two new programs were launched under this series:

- The Executive Certificate in Fintech and Innovation helps professionals integrate design principles, emerging technologies and new business models into their company's digital ecosystem.
- The Executive Certificate in Strategic Value Creation is designed for individuals involved in the value creation process for their organisation. It helps them gain an in-depth understanding of how digital transformation can be incorporated into the strategy and business planning process for value creation.

These courses, catering to mid-level management and C-suites, are modular and will help accounting and finance professionals to be competitive in the digital economy. The innovative programs are certified by SMU, and Singaporeans and PRs can tap SkillsFuture funding to defray the cost.

CPA Australia's Profession Session in Singapore was held on 26 January. One of the largest career conventions for the local accounting and finance sector, the annual event prepares students, graduates, and young accounting professionals to launch their careers.

LEVELLING UP CORPORATE GOVERNANCE STANDARDS

CPA Australia is proud to be part of the continuous journey towards a better corporate governance culture in Singapore.

In collaboration with the Centre for Governance, Institutions and Organisations (CGIO) at NUS Business School, and Singapore Institute of Directors (SID), the best-governed and transparent Singapore-listed companies were recognised at the annual Singapore Governance and Transparency Forum 2019.

They were ranked by the Singapore Governance and Transparency Index (SGTI), a leading benchmark for assessing listed companies on their corporate governance disclosure and practices, as well as the timeliness, accessibility and transparency of their financial results announcements.

Record-high scores in the SGTI reflect a greater commitment by Singapore-listed companies towards better governance.

Corporate Governance Case Studies Volume 8 was launched in partnership with Associate Professor Mak Yuen Teen FCPA (Aust.) of the NUS Business School.






