Complete your degree

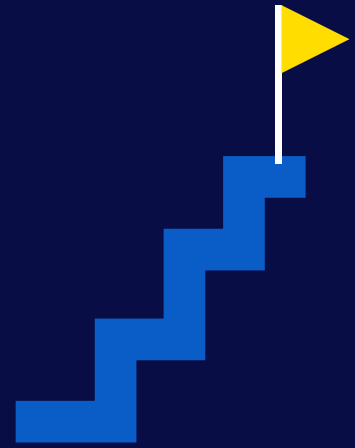
